President Rick Anderson's Thoughts

Our pump and a little July rain helped lake level almost hold at minus seven. On August 1, level was at minus eight. I have seen many Bass Lake Augusts; lake level always went up and down; I expect that will happen this August too. Looking back, lake level was minus 10 inches on September 1, 2020.

I missed our Annual July Property Owners meeting; however, in a follow-up meeting, the Board agreed to revise the bylaws to improve future election procedures and to return to the practice of making the unapproved minutes of the previous meeting available prior to the next meeting. At our August 21 meeting we will do some 2022 planning. Who will be on which committee? What will be new? Will a new welcome sign be installed at the three way stop by Memorial Day 2022? Stuff like that. July did turn out to be pretty normal and I expect August we will also be normal. The Festival was great. My buddy Roger ended July with a pig roast on his 80th birthday. A pair of stockings completed the outfit.

The lady in the center is wearing a very daring outfit, since it exposes her neck. As late as 1910, a lady might be arrested for exposing her lower legs, upper arms, or neck. It would be the 1920's before

skirts and long pants were not worn when swimming. At the time of this picture, it was just becoming widely acceptable for women to go swimming. It would be 1930 before men dared to expose

Help Stop Aquatic Hitchhikers - Boaters, kayakers, and other waterloving recreationists beware: starry stonewort is on the move. These invasive macroalgae were first discovered in Indiana in Lake Wawasee in

2008 and have spread to more than 40 lakes across northern Indiana. Stop Aquatic Hitchhikers! is a growing effort that helps recreational water users be part of the solution to help prevent and slow the spread of aquatic invasive species.

Lake activities such as recreational boating, angling, waterfowl hunting, and diving may spread aquatic invasive species. Some aquatic invasive species can attach to boats, while others can become tangled on propellers, anchor lines, or boat trailers. Many species can survive in bilge water, ballast tanks, and motors or may hide in dirt or sand that clings to nets, buckets, anchors, and waders.



Fortunately, completing simple steps can prevent the transport of aquatic invasive species. Remember to Clean, Drain, Dry... In every waterbody, every time. Learn more at https://stopaquatichitchhikers.org/

Changes at Bass Lake Beach & Campground—If you'd like to give your input regarding the exciting changes to the Bass Lake Beach & Campground, attend the Park Board meeting on September 14 at 6:00 p.m. at the Annex Building or contact Park Board members. See Starke County website.

Bass Lake Conservancy District (BLCD) - Where is the rain? July rainfall, 2.55", July avg. rainfall, 4.60". YTD rainfall. 24.93". Looks like we are on track to be below our normal yearly average of 38.29"! The better news. After a second lake survey by Aquatic Control, 10.6 acres of Eurasian Milfoil was observed that was not found in the first survey. Aquatic Control submitted a request with the Indiana DNR for a permit amendment to treat this acreage. Approval was granted to treat 7.75 acres (see map on BLCD website, www.blcd-ind.org.) The areas were treated the week of August 9. This will be the last vegetation treatment approved this year. As they say, sumptin' is better than nuttin'!

Please visit the BLCD website to review what should and should not be flushed into the sewers. We recently experienced a major repair at the main pump. "Flushable" biodegradable wipes do not biodegrade before reaching the pumps so do not flush them. When the pump was pulled, an all night project, the bottom was clogged with wipes and other items. A reminder, the District maintains its own web server to keep you updated on important, current issues. Your email address will never be shared.
