Rainfall and the pump should have water flowing over the dam before April's end. Last April, I measured lake level at minus 13 inches. 2022 will certainly be different than 2021. All over the lake, piers are going in. Some shore stations are already in too. Boat owners who kept their boats and lifts on the shore last year seem ready not to repeat that. Looks like a great season is ahead of us. Aquatic vegetation concerns me some. We did have a hard winter and water clarity is about 12 inches less than last year blocking some sunlight. Aquatic Control will be soon doing a weed survey. A LARE grant has been applied for and hopefully the Conservancy District will receive DNR approval to treat weeds where and when needed.

After two years of COVID, traditional Bass Lake handshakes and hugs should be back. Our taverns, restaurants and local businesses are ready for a great season. BLPOA rentals have resumed and this year we will be having the spring "Meet & Greet". The first "A Taste of Bass Lake Pizza" has been sent out using our email distribution. Send in your \$5.00 and tell your friends to send theirs in too. That is how names get on the "Who's Coming So Far List". When you are on the list, you will find your experience at the door easier. The event is on Saturday, May 21. When more members know each other, friendships develop and our lake becomes a better community. Previous "A Taste of Bass Lake Pizza" events had over 300 sign up and many new friendships began. Also, seems pizza is a good break from spring cleaning and doing lake stuff like pier painting. Construction work has begun on the solar farm and last month the BLPOA signed a Doral "Term Sheet" agreement outlining expectation for a second pump. If you are at the Knox VFW, tickets for the \$630K grand prize are still \$1. Besides reasonably priced drinks and great food you can ask about the \$100 Easter egg believed to still be in the lake. Bass Lake Conservancy District - Good news!

The lake water is at the top of the weir. March rainfall came in at 3.27". Year-to-date rainfall is 7.07". The lake pump added 33.4 million gallons into our lake. Get your boats and water toys out. A "Do Not Flush" poster is available on our website to remind your guests (especially those with Airbnb properties) to flush only toilet paper and human waste into the sewer system. It is on our website page under "Important Message About The Sanitary Sewers." There is a wealth of information available for you on the website including how to make automatic payments of your sewer bill. Take a look.

Lastly, rest assured that what can be done, will be done with regards to treating invasive lake vegetation. The DNR has approved the spring survey on May 2, weather permitting. They wanted late May, but we are determined to manage it. The ideal water temperature for lake vegetation growth is 50-60 degrees F. The current temperature is 51 degrees. We have awarded the contract to Aquatic Control to treat the lake as soon as the DNR releases the Bass Lake permit. The DNR controls the timing of our treatment plan. Cleave's Chute

About 100 years ago, Cleave's Chute was a popular attraction at Bass Lake. It was located on the lake's northeast side at Winona and included a beach, where one could even "rent" bathing suits. We can only imagine how fast what looks like a traditional toboggan would have zoomed down this 30 foot drop into the water. Tom Cleave was the owner and operator of this early Bass Lake establishment.
