President's Letter

Ice Sailing at Bass Lake!

Earlier this month there were ice boats competing at Bass Lake.

These sailboats are supported on metal runners, steered with a rear blade. They race over ice at speeds of up to 60 mph.

My best guess on lake level is minus 9 inches; that's what it was on January 19 before the lake refroze. For the most part it has been a warm winter with little snow. So far, the ice fishing season has been short. I haven't seen many ice skaters either. I have seen ice boats racing twice. I talked to one of the racers, he said he got up to 58 mph. I'm predicting an early spring and expect to see several piers in by mid-March. As far as I know the record for the earliest pier remains February 28. Eleven years ago I was close. In 2012, I put half my pier in on February 29. If you are going to try for the record, it's time to get your team together. I think the hardest requirement in breaking this record is a good long range weather forecast. A refrozen lake with your pier in is bad.

The February 4 Property Owner meeting: The October, November and December Treasurer's reports were reviewed & approved for audit. The BLPOA total accounts were \$239,497. We intend to once again have a Pizza Party on May 20. Social Committee Funds available are \$3,912. Building rentals brought in \$4,190 in 2022 with 6 rentals so far for 2023. Building maintenance contracted for the new ceiling in the Blue Room; several positive comments were noted. From the garbage/recycle committee report: BEGINNING FEBRUARY 27, FOR LARGE ITEMS, CALLS WILL NO LONGER BE REQUIRED. REPUBLIC WILL BEGIN A LARGE ITEM PICKUP ROUTE THE 4TH MONDAY OF EACH MONTH. Talks have also been initiated for a contract extension with Republic. Republic has asked for and we have supplied them with an up-to-date authorized pick up list. Make sure you 2022 stickers are on display. We are implementing a new policy; we'll distribute the normal garbage stickers along with a sticker that will go onto garbage containers. Ron Vendl is working on our Bass Lake Directory. The DNR Boating class is expected to be at Bass Lake probably in June. You are welcome to attend the Starke County Park Board meeting the second Tuesday of each month at 6:00 p.m. in the Starke County Annex. The 2023 Annual Letter and Membership Forms will go out by email about February 15; both will go out to all members by U.S. mail the end of March. There are no known problems with the second pump project. An update report will be given at the March Property Owner meeting. The new "Welcome to Bass Lake" signs are here and will be installed soon. Our 2023 glacial stone LARE grant request has been submitted to the State of Indiana. Starke County Commissioner Mark Gourley addressed the group giving an update on county activities. All the bars and eateries on the lake seem to be doing well. If you go to Knox, at the "V", a \$1 donation might win you \$159,777. Lastly, don't forget your sweetheart on Valentines Day. Never Been Published - Bass Lake Stats

The Bass Lake Conservancy District (BLCD) ended 2022 with a total of 1048 accounts: <u>372</u> live at the lake year-round, <u>254</u> have second homes in Indiana, and <u>422</u> have second homes outside of Indiana. It also saw <u>47</u> homes sold, <u>6</u> new hookups, <u>1</u> disconnect, and <u>26</u> Bass Lake Rentals advertised. <u>413</u> or <u>39.4</u>% pay their monthly fee via our secure bank EFT (Electronic Fund Transfer) process.

The BLCD has collected a total of 639 email addresses and sent out 23 informational email bulletins from our email server. Contact us to see if we have your current email address, or want to provide one.

DNR Plan for Stocking Bass Lake By: Tom Bacula, Indiana DNR

The DNR is planning to stock our lake with small walleye in late April or early May. The fish will be about an inch long, and will be 7 to 10-day old fish. The larger walleye that had been stocked in the past couple of years have not shown up in our fish surveys any better than the small fry stocking that worked for years. Larger and older fish are more difficult to get for the stocking of Bass Lake. Note that the DNR has a fish stocking database which is new to the State of Indiana website. Farmers Market at Bass Lake? By Deb Mix, Purdue University

Healthy foods are nutritious foods. Good nutrition is considered good medicine. That's my focus here in Starke County; healthy food and physical activity. Did you know that Knox has a farmers market? The Knox Farmers Market runs from April through October. There are a limited amount of vendors, but the more people who attend, the more vendors will want to be there. It is by the old Moose Club on Main Street, across from the Courthouse. Consider checking it out when it opens. It's difficult to keep a Farmers Market open in an area where farming is a major part of the community.

I have looked into a Farmers Market at Bass Lake, but it takes someone who is a champion for the market. I can help with the tasks and provide information. We would need a person committed to the market, be there at least weekly, and be the "Market Master." A Market Master is someone who is willing to take responsibility for the garden and be the point person for all the vendors. (S)he finds the location, gets permission for its use and orchestrates the marketing. If you are interested, please contact me at <u>mix0@purdue.edu</u>. (That's a zero after mix.)

Knox also has a community garden. It is on US 35 behind the Nazarene Church. Rick Martin is the garden master and has already started to plant seeds under lights. If you have time to help at the garden, please contact Rick via email at <u>knxcommgrdn@yahoo.com</u>. Rick arranges work days, usually early Saturday mornings. There are other days as well based on the needs of the garden. The work is done by volunteers. The harvest is provided to those who help and also to organizations that have clients that need fresh food. I have successfully received a grant for the garden to get garden equipment and also have procured free seeds. My work with Purdue Extension is very unique for an Extension office. Most employed are educators. Instead, my role is to work with community leaders to assist find ways to make healthy options available in the community. Purple Martins by Nancy Peters

The wonderful Purple Martins are due back at Bass Lake in late March to early April. (See map below for migration timeline) Now is the time to ensure your martin house is clean and ready for the season. Hopefully, we will have a warm Spring so they can hunt for food when they arrive, otherwise, you may want to provide mealworms or egg shells as a supplemental food source. Temperatures below forty degrees are too cold for the martins to hunt for food and they may not survive such harsh weather. If martins arrive during a snowstorm and are roosting on your house, you may open the compartments early to provide shelter from the cold and snow. Popular belief is that landlords wait a month after spotting the first scout at their site, however, waiting a month is not always optimal. Miss Bass Lake 1926

In 1926, the Taggert Hotel, near Cedar Point at Bass Lake, sponsored a Bathing Beauty Contest. Miss Bonnie Rogers was declared Miss Bass Lake. Miss Rogers was given a loving cup, a three-pound box of candy, a bottle of perfume, and a fancy pair of garters.

Emily McCormick was second and Mildred Tompkins third. Others participating in the event were Misses La Verne and Vivian Cannon, Dorothy DeMont, Artis Loudermilk, Dorothy Crews, Esther Neupert and Violet Engle. Later Bonnie Rogers became Mrs. Bonnie Taylor and was the secretary at the Knox High School for many years.
